ABOUT US...

Who We Are?

The founder of the Let's Hear Foundation, Bruce McKay has a long history of hearing impediments and also suffers from menières disease. During February of 2014 Bruce realised that there just was not enough been done to assist persons with hearing impediments so after consulting various specialists and getting a great team of advisors together, the Let's Hear Foundation was formed during March 2014.

What We Do?

Our aim is to assist persons with hearing impediments no matter the age or cultural backgrounds, and no matter the hearing impediment, including fund raising events where necessary for cochlear implants and bone anchored hearing aids. We currently supply hearing aids to any person who meets our criteria for selection at absolutely no cost wherever possible.

What We Want To Achieve?

We would like to be the number one foundation for creating awareness to the general public about hearing loss through communication and information. We would like to see all persons with hearing impediments, no matter how serious they are to be treated with respect and acknowledged for the role they play in our society.

CRITERIA & SELECTION PROCESS 1...

The criteria below is used when assessing the recipient's hearing loss needs:

- No racial and/or gender discrimination will be exercised with application for assistance
- Applications without medical insurance will get preference
- No discrimination in type of hearing loss will be administered
- Applicants are to provide an audiogram from a registered audiologist for verification of hearing loss
- Applicants must be financially secure enough to be able to purchase batteries for the aids and attend follow up visits to check the hearing aids – the foundation does however assist where possible
- Hearing aid availability is not guaranteed and will be on a first come first serve basis
- Contractual agreement must be accepted and signed

CRITERIA & SELECTION PROCESS 2...

- Once the hearing loss has been identified by one of our assisting audiologists, a list
 of available hearing aids are sent to them for identification and matching criteria to
 the said hearing loss
- This hearing aid is then packed by the foundation and sent to the relative audiologist for fitting
- Once the hearing aid/s have been fitted, the contractual agreement is signed and sent back to the foundation
- A photograph and short letter of thanks is then requested from the hearing aid/s recipient and sent to the foundation
- Follow up emails and telecons are done to check on the recipient's progress
- Should the recipient of a hearing aid/s need an upgrade due to possibly further hearing loss over time, then a re-application can be made

Morning Bruce, I've just received this message from Jason, nephew of the Dorringtons


Hi Jason,

- We have ongoing communication with them pertaining to their needs







Hearing Aids

- Phonak
- Widex
- Oticon
- Siemans

The above are the most used hearing aids and seem to be preferred by most audiologists because their longevity seems to be better and the technology is freely available for setups, etc.

We are not able to use the inner ear hearing aids for cost reasons. The hearing aid behind the ear is by far the better option, as the new shapes are not as expensive to manufacture.

The biggest problem in Africa is the cost of health insurance and the actual hearing aid itself. There are many people who simply cannot afford the luxury of a hearing aid, and this is where the foundation comes in. We need to bridge the gap as much as possible and try to ensure that everyone can experience a good quality of life.

Hearing Aids Continued

Once we receive the hearing aids, they are sorted, cleaned (if necessary) and then catalogued by brand, etc., see photos below and sample list attached.

• The next step is to ensure that the hearing aids are correctly included in a list, which is then readily available when applying for support.

That list shall be updated as soon as a hearing aid has been sent to an applicant.







What does the future hold?

- We hope that once we have been successfully registered as a non-profit organization in South Africa, we can begin to raise much-needed funds to support applicants with bone-anchored hearing aids and cochlear implants where possible..
- As mentioned in the report, this year we will be looking at the goal of penetrating the
 rest of Africa, with a focus on Kenya, Botswana, Namibia and Zambia with the
 support of the 41 clubs of that country.
- We will also focus on establishing contacts with at least 1 audiologist in every major city in South Africa, allowing us to help more people.
- Due to financial constraints, we are currently unable to market the foundation locally, but will do our best to improve our social media presence, especially through Facebook.
- From the end of March 2023, we will also start our first monthly clinic in Bloemfontein and depending on how successful this is, we would like to branch out to our major cities in South Africa.

In Closing

- I believe that during 2023 the Foundation will gain momentum with Tanja, who will help to disseminate the information and actively participate in the management and marketing of the Foundation.
- We are very grateful to our Swiss subsidiaries Beat & Esther Berger and 41 Club Switzerland, who support us in every respect.
- We are also grateful to Neuroth for supporting us with the hearing aids
